In 2021-2022, Bike/Walk Central Florida (BWCF) witnessed unprecedented growth. We added new partners to our growing list of long-time stakeholders and expanded our reach to new neighborhoods and cities who have joined our effort for safer streets for all users, especially the vulnerable ones. Fixing our roads, building trails and changing driver behavior is not easy and it takes a long time. I believe it's important to always take time to reflect on our small and big wins.

BWCF doesn't exist and operate alone as an organization. We are part of a growing community of passionate people and organizations dedicated to a world where active transportation is the norm and we can feel comfortable doing it. With their help and yours, here is what we accomplished in 2022:

- We launched the Bike/Walk Kids Program and hosted the Pineloch Play it Safe event and collaborated with kid's entertainer and composer Richard Peeples to create "Left, Right, Left" song teaching children how to safely cross the street.
- We grew the Bike 5 (formerly Bike 5 Cities) event and included a shorter distance ride to encourage everyone of all ages and abilities to participate.
- We continued to move the needle to make walking, biking and rolling safer in Central Florida.
- Built our organization's volunteer and staff capacity to provide consultation services to communities seeking our guidance and community direction in their planning efforts.

I was outdoors being active 291 days last year and I see the infrastructure changes happening, but we have a long way to go for our metrics to show the results of that work in fewer crashes and deaths on our roads. Our journey ahead is exciting and we are eternally grateful for your support.



*Transportation disadvantaged means those persons who because of physical or mental disability, income status, or age are unable to transport themselves or to purchase transportation and are, therefore, dependent upon others to obtain access to health care, employment, education, shopping, social activities, or other life-sustaining activities, or children who are handicapped or high-risk or at-risk as defined in Florida Statute Section 411.202.

Each new board member brings a fresh perspective, valuable skill set, and a dedicated desire to help address the needs of our organization's mission and vision by working in conjunction with the Bike/Walk Central Florida staff in advocating for bikeable and walkable communities through supporting infrastructure changes, raising awareness throughout the community, and helping to incorporate cycling and walking into people's daily activities.



OUR BOARD IN ACTION

TECHNICAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE

This year, the board established its first Technical Advisory Committee (TAC).

The TAC is responsible for reviewing projects which this year included supporting the:

 Development of the Packing District Trail connections

Providing recommendations on:

- Florida bicycle rumble strips
- City of Apopka advisory shoulder
- · Casselberry speed cushions
- Aloma/Howell branch –

- Edgewater Drive Study

The TAC's hands-on involvement provokes and encourages community conversations that are necessary to understand and embrace change.

ADVOCATING FOR DEDICATED FUNDING FOR TRANSPORTATION SAFETY IN CENTRAL FLORIDA

ORANGE COUNTY SALES TAX INITIATIVE

Our BWCF team was invited to speak at the Move Orange Forward launch event. We provided commentary to the Orlando Sentinel about the effort and shared our opinions and expert insight with the Orlando Business Journal. Additionally, we were asked to review and edit the Transportation Dashboard for the Move Orange Forward effort.



While we may not have successfully moved the mountain, we have taken valuable steps in educating the local residents and gaining recognition from Mayor Demings and other community leaders by having a seat at the campaign table.

BEST FOOT FORWARD FOR PEDESTRIAN SAFETY

ABOUT THE PROGRAM

Best Foot Forward (BFF) campaign was conceived to address a Dangerous by Design report that listed Orlando as the most dangerous metropolitan area for pedestrians in the United States. The mission of BFF is to increase the number of drivers stopping for pedestrians at crosswalks, as Florida law requires, through community education, low-cost engineering, high-visibility enforcement, and data-driven evaluation.

Our programs help foster behavior change in drivers at marked crosswalks. We aim to educate people on active transportation safety and facilitate healthy habits in specific communities.















NEW PROGRAM! BIKE/WALK KIDS



We helped facilitate and support teaching kids (and adults) how to ride bicycles safely and comfortably in our community.

We launched Bike/Walk Kids which included co-hosting an event with the Jordan Smelski Foundation, giving away 1,000 bicycles to local Central Florida youth.

We hosted the Pineloch Plays it Safe event and collaborated with kid's entertainer and composer Richard Peeples to create "Left, Right, Left" song teaching children how to safety cross the street.

We also participated in Scopes and Spokes with our partners reThink Your Commute and Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), as well as supported a bike rodeo at Keene's Elementary.



Our signature bicycling advocacy event grew in miles and in participants.

This year, we rebranded the event to "Bike 5" and included two additional rides, dubbed Bike 5 Miles and Bike 5 Parks (11 miles), for those who might not be able to take a long route around 5 cities.

These two routes stick to bike-friendly streets and are centered along the Cady Way Trail. In addition, the signature 28-mile route grew an additional 2 miles with the addition of portions of Seminole County's Kewannee Trail and the Oxford Road complete street project in the City of Casselberry, which includes dedicated buffered bike lanes and a wide multi-use path.



HEALTHY WEST ORANGE TRAILS CONNECTION

We helped facilitate the launch of a trails activation program centered around health.

Healthy West Orange Trails Connection (HWOTC) was born from the need to activate, engage and cultivate a healthy culture around trails in West Orange County. The West Orange Health Care District and the Foundation for a Healthier West Orange spearheaded the work to promote and support these efforts, along with five municipal partners: cities of Winter Garden, Ocoee, Windermere, the town of Oakland, and the rural settlement of Gotha. Additional partners supporting the effort include Orange County, Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), East Central Florida Regional Planning Council (ECFRPC), and MetroPlan Orlando.







In the first year of facilitation, this group achieved the following:

Activation

- Scheduled the first Take Over the Trails Day, a yearly event that will allow sponsors and partners to interact with trail users and provide outreach for HWOTC, its mission and accomplishments.
- Began developing an online map depicting events on or near trails in West Orange County.

Safety

- Distributed a survey to identify concerns on the West Orange Trail and mapped them for use in identifying segments to audit.
- Conducted the first of many trail safety audits from Apopka Vineland Outpost to Keene Blvd, to identify safety and quality concerns and provide recommendations on action items for addressing those concerns.

Beautification + Enhancement


- Planted live oaks and fire bushes on the West Orange Trail along Hennis Road with the help of Bloom and Grow Garden Society, Orange County Parks and Recreation, the City of Winter Garden and the Friends of Lake Apopka.
 Informational signage about HWOTC and its partners' involvement in the project was also placed.
- Planted 100 Confederate Jasmine along the wire fence adjacent to Central Florida Expressway Authority (CFX) property running along West Road.
- Began efforts on a trailside development guidelines document to offer recommended guidelines to HWOTC jurisdictions for how trailside developments should interact with the trail in different contexts.


We supported trail development in our community through collaboration and partnerships.

WORKING WITH THE COMMUNITY

PACKING DISTRICT TRAIL PLAN

Dr. Phillips Inc. approached Bike/Walk Central Florida in July 2020 with the desire to work together to create an internal trail route through the newly formed Packing District and connect those trails to Edgewater Drive and Downtown Orlando. Bike/Walk Central Florida worked with stakeholders including the City of Orlando, Orange County, Central Florida Railroad, Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) and the Orlando Bike Coalition to review data, analyze potential routes and create trail routes that would connect the Packing District to Downtown Orlando, Ivanhoe Village, Edgewater Drive, Pine Hills and ultimately the Florida Coast-to-Coast Trail. Bike/Walk Central Florida will continue to work with the stakeholders to implement these trail routes and support infrastructure in the future.

We became an online resource for all things bike and pedestrian, including developing the first regional interactive Bike Trail Map in partnership with xGeographic and with support from the Catalyst Design Group and Hale Innovation.
